A total number of 87 sample materials have been collected and catalogued by the consortium, and a sample of 60 of such documents have been analysed and evaluated based on the criteria of accuracy, comprehensiveness, suitability, coherence with the regulatory environment, delivery quality and clarity, certification, cross-border relevance, accessibility.
